The Special Districts Association of Monterey County (SDAMC) met in person on April 18, 2022 with Director Verbanec and the General Manager attending. Treasurer Rick Verbanec reported the SDAMC bank account was steady as the primary cost for the group is the quarterly dinners.

Jeanna Arnold, Local Governmental Affairs Representative for Pacific Gas and Electric (PG&E) made a presentation on the Community PG&E Wildfire Safety Program. A copy of the slide presentation is attached. She reported on PG&E efforts to reduce Public Safety Power Shutoffs (PSPS). PG&E has a goal to underground 10,000 miles of line in the next ten years. Locally, a three mile undergrounding project is scheduled next year in Santa Cruz County. PG&E is adding advanced technologies to the electric system infrastructure to allow smaller areas to be isolated during a PSPS. The number of PSPS events reduced from 7 in 2019 impacting 2 million customers to 5 in 2021 impacting 80,000 customers. Jeanna also reported on enhanced powerline safety settings (EPSS) which allows power to be turned off within one-tenth of a second if a tree branch or object strikes the line. There is an 80% reduction in CPUC reportable ignitions in 2021 on EPSS enabled circuits compared to the prior three year average.

Charlotte Holifield, California Special District Association (CSDA) Public Affairs Field Coordinator for the coastal zone, reported Legislative Days will be May 16-17th in Sacramento. She also reported CSDA opposes an initiative titled Taxpayer Protection and Government Accountability Act that will change the rules for how state and local governments can raise taxes.

Kate McKenna, executive director of the Monterey County Local Agency Formation Commission (LAFCO) reported that Mary Ann Leffel was elected to a regular Special District position on LAFCO. An election for the Special District alternative position is underway. Kate also reported the Monterey Peninsula Water Management District has filed a lawsuit against LAFCO for denying activation of a latent power to deliver potable water. LAFCO has a litigation reserve of \$300,000. Special Districts pay for one-third of the LAFCO budget, including any legal costs exceeding the litigation reserve.

The next SDA meeting is scheduled for Tuesday, July 19, 2022 at 6:00 pm either virtually or at the Bayonet and Black Horse Golf Course Clubhouse in Seaside.
