DRAFT MINUTES OF THE REGULAR QUARTERLY MEETING OF THE SPECIAL DISTRICTS ASSOCIATION OF MONTEREY COUNTY

April 19, 2011

1 & 2. Call to Order and Self-Serve buffet dinner:

President Judi Lehman called the regular quarterly meeting of the SDAMC to order and noted that a quorum was present; 26 members from 13 Special Districts & 6 guests (See attached list for names). Following introductions, everyone enjoyed the dinner buffet served by the Shoreline Occupation Service staff.

3. Guest Speaker:

(For purposes of the Minutes recorder keeping only, guest speakers are assigned agenda/Minutes space number 6, but are routinely taken out of order to accommodate last minute changes in scheduling.)

Mary Zeeb, Monterey County Treasurer-Tax Collector gave a PowerPoint presentation including an overview of her office's responsibilities, property tax data, and treasury data. Following her presentation, she answered several questions from those present. Mary pointed out that copies of the county's investment policy are available on the Treasurer-Tax Collector's website.

4. Approval of Minutes:

Following a motion by Russ Jeffries and seconded by Ian Oglesby, the minutes for the regular January 18, 2011 meeting were approved by unanimous vote.

5. New/Old Business:

a. Review budget, goals, and objectives for 2011 – haven't been able to get the committee together yet; more to follow at the next meeting.

6. Reports:

- a. Legislative Chair Report Ben Post Ben stated information coming from the Governor's office is in a state of flux. Hoping to see things start to settle down after the budget adoption process sorts itself out. - Finance Committee Chair Report Carl Miller
 Received \$800 in January, spent \$643 for meals, leaving \$2546 account
 balance. <u>INFO ONLY NO ACTION NEEDED</u>
 President Lehman added that if we are able to keep the fund balance at or
 above \$2500, we don't have to pay bank fees.

- c. CSDA Region 3 Representative Report Vince Ferrante
 -The By-Laws committee met last month, there are language changes pending.
 - -The Membership committee met last week, continuing efforts to enhance the relationships between the state association and the chapters. The intent is to strengthen member numbers, to give some value to the member services, and to quantify what members receive in return for their dues. Further efforts are ongoing to increase on-line publications, information, and educational tools.
 - -in planning for the October conference in October, Vince and the membership chair of CSDA toured the Moss Landing Harbor and Kirby Park via the Elkhorn Slough. Yesterday, they toured the Monterey Regional Waste Management Facility at Marina.
 - -The next meeting will be held in Sacramento next month. Looking to get Neil McCormick, president of CSDA down to one of our quarterly meetings.
 - -CSDA will have their annual conference in Monterey on October 11-13, 2011. This is a great opportunity to attend the conference at a low cost without the need for travel or lodging. Look for future information on line at http://csda.net
 - -Vince also hopes to get CSDA Executive Director Neil McCormick to speak at our October MCSDA meeting, which may necessitate a date change from the usual 3rd Tuesday of the month.
 - -Moss Landing Harbor District has nominated Vince for Harriet Greeve's vacant seat on the CSDA board. Vince's intent is to be able to be more pro-active by having a seat on the board, to better represent this association.
 - -Working with LAFCO to update all special districts' mailing addresses and points of contact.
- d. LAFCO Representative Report Graig Stephens
 Looking at Service Reviews for Fire Protection Agencies and Emergency
 Medical Services. Also starting to see some Sphere of Influence and
 Annexation applications; Aromas Water, Carmel Highlands and Cypress
 Fire Districts, Pajaro/ Sunny Mesa among others.
- e. Other Reports: LAFCO Kate McKenna
 Kate announced that as a result of Tom Moore's vacancy, an election of three qualified candidates was held, in which 33 of 43 districts voted.
 Candidates were Mary Ann Leffell of Monterey Peninsula Airport Distict,

Steve Snodgrass of Pajaro / Sunny Mesa Water District, and Paul Ingram of the Carmel Valley Recreation and Park District. Steve Snodgrass received the most votes, and will join the LAFCO board at next Monday's meeting, when he will be sworn in, and the vote will be certified by the commission.

7. Members Comments:

- Vince Ferrante mentioned there is a workshop for Board Secretaries scheduled for Monterey. See the CSDA website for registration information.
- There will be a pre-conference golf tournament at Blackhorse / Bayonet in October, and more information on that will be included in the conference mailing.
- Mike Urquides suggested putting minutes and agenda's into email, attempt to cut down on postage, and "go-green".
- Judi mentioned that if any district has a name change, their board needs to adopt a resolution with the intention of "applying" to the Special Districts' Association to keep the membership roster accurate. See Paula for a sample resolution.
