DRAFT MINUTES OF THE REGULAR QUARTERLY MEETING OF THE SPECIAL DISTRICTS ASSOCIATION OF MONTEREY COUNTY

July 19, 2011

1. Call to Order:

President Judi Lehman called the regular quarterly meeting of the SDAMC to order, and requested those present to serve themselves at the buffet dinner. Judi expressed appreciation to Paula Riso for her continued hard work and dedication to the association; Judi also thanked the Shoreline staff for the great dinner. 28 members from 20 Special Districts & 5 guests (See attached list for names).

2. Guest Speaker(s):

(For purposes of the Minutes recorder keeping only, guest speakers are assigned agenda/Minutes space number 6, but are routinely taken out of order to accommodate last minute changes in scheduling.)

Megan Hemming – Director of Education, California Special Districts Association
Megan advised the association of their Educational Catalog, upcoming Board Secretary /
Clerk training coming to Monterey March 1 & 2, 2012. Board secretaries and clerks are
able to earn a certificate from CSDA, and highlighted the annual conference also coming
to Monterey October 10-13, to be held at the Monterey Conference Center. Following
this information, Megan presented a Power Point program about the annual conference.

<u>Paul Robbins – Executive Director, Resource Conservation District of Monterey County</u> Paul presented a Power Point program outlining the basics of the RCD, origins in the USDA relating to soil erosion of the 1930's, Resources available, Directors, Staff, Strategic Plan, Modes of Work, and Partnerships. 3. Approval of Minutes:

Following a motion by Russ Jeffries and seconded by Don Champion, the minutes for the regular April 19, 2010 meeting were approved by unanimous vote.

4. New/Old Business:

<u>a. Review Budget, Goals and Objectives for 2011: Carl Miller</u> Carl highlighted ideas formulated by the sub-committee:

1. Dues. Currently, the association generates minimal quarterly revenue from the money collected for the dinner. This balance is currently running at approximately \$2500, which coincidentally is the minimum balance required by the bank for "free" checking. The committee felt that if we could collect a minimal amount of annual dues, we could have some money available to cover travel expenses or conference fees for some members of this association *if their parent district couldn't afford to pay*.

- 2. Members Directory: the idea would be to centralize the association members' information, either in traditional hard copy or electronically on a website with a public side, and a members side.
- 3. Speaker directory: we currently collect names of suggested future speakers; the idea would be to keep this as a continuing item in the minutes or on a website for reference purposes.
- 4. LAFCO list: list of potential new members to reach out to.
- 5. Recognition Pins: would recognize years of service in the association, accomplishments, or major milestones.
- 6. Strategic Planning: where are we? What is it we want to accomplish? Where do we want to go? Do we want to get more involved in this county?

This generated good discussion as to whether or not this association actually belongs to the CSDA. Not every district within the SDAMC belongs to CSDA, due to the cost of dues. Russ believes that CSDA recognizes us as a member, even though "new" chapters must have 100% dues paying membership.

7. Is there interest in a more social event, such as the Christmas season? Something where spouses / significant others would also attend?

5. Reports:

- a. <u>Legislative Chair Report Ben Post</u>
 - 1. The Orange County Grand Jury has recently "rated" water districts; specifically, how "transparent" were they on their websites? Some of the things the jury looked at:
 - are the district's financial easily accessible on the website?
 - -if there is compensation provided, are the salaries disclosed (within ranges)
 - are the budgets posted? Are they totally transparent?

2. Conflict of Interest:

-The Supreme Court recently ruled on a California individual who was a member of a public board. The court found that if a member is an acquaintance or friend of an individual who has a position and they might benefit financially (or would be fiscally impacted) from you voting a particular way on your board, you must recuse yourself to avoid a conflict of interest (ethics) situation. This would even work in reverse, (e.g. if a board were voting to terminate a contract with a vendor, the board member who has a "relationship" with the vendor should recuse him / her self.) Ben will send the information to Paula, and asked that she get it to the members.

- b. <u>Finance Committee Chair Report George Haines</u> Nothing to add. INFO ONLY NO ACTION NEEDED
- c. <u>CSDA Region 3 Representative Report Russ Jeffries in place of Vince Ferrante</u> Nothing further to report.
- d. <u>LAFCO Representative Report –Don Champion & Graig Stephens</u>
 Don deferred to Thom McCue, reporting for Kate McKenna;
 Graig advised that with Vince DiMaggio's resignation, the Public Member position on LAFCO is now vacant. It's been a long time since this has occurred, so Kate advises that a committee will be formed to interview candidates, and this will be determined with the current board chairperson.

LAFCO's budget is 4% less than last year's, and that was lower than previous years.

Fire Districts are meeting to discuss a couple of annexations, and municipal service reviews for EMS and Fire Districts are under way. State law dictates a 5 year cycle for service reviews; all of these are being done "in-house". A small annexation being reviewed for Pajaro County Sanitation District. Other districts have some form of applications pending, such as Pajaro Sunny Mesa, Marina Coast, Aromas Water District. Also talking with Carmel Area Waste Water District.

The public member position to be filled cannot be a board member of a special district or city council; cannot be an employee of those agencies. Thom brought copies of special notice for the open filing period. The person will be selected by the LAFCO commissioners.

Not a lot of activity in Sacramento related to special districts.
