Draft SDAMC Minutes April 19, 2016

President Pete Poitras called the meeting to order at 6 pm –invited everyone begin dinner.

3. Invited speakers Lt. Bill Clark and Sgt. Mike Bruno of the Peninsula Regional Violence and Narcotics Team (PRVNT):

The police departments at Carmel, Monterey, Pacific Grove, Sand City and Seaside contribute resources to the team that focuses on regional crimes and gang activity, helping the smaller jurisdictions with only one or a part time detective to investigate crimes.

Several years ago when Seaside had a number of gang related shootings, they were able to apprehend a small number of gang leaders responsible for most of the activity. The gang activity subsequently diminished.

They indicated Salinas is a hub for the Nortenos gang. Gang members have learned to reduce their tattoos and other indications of membership to avoid scrutiny by police.

For males aged 10-24, Monterey County has the highest per capita homicide rate in California.

The PRVNT representatives have found intel/information is more important than patrols to address gang issues. They also suggested that improved school and after school activities could prove an important factor in preventing youth from joining gangs.

Financial statement presented – bank account is balancing payments with expenditures for meals at Shoreline - additional contributions to account will be made by larger districts to avoid bank account service charges.

CSDA - A representative from California Special Districts Association presented information on the Districts Make a Difference website which illustrates the value of special districts.

LAFCO - Kate McKenna, Executive Director of the Local Agency Formation Commission of Monterey County, reported Pete Poitras was elected regular Special District LAFCO representative and an election for the alternate representative is under way. She also indicated the proposed budget for LAFCO next year will increase 4%.
