President Warren "Pete" Poitras called the meeting of the Special Districts Association of Monterey County (SDAMC) to order at 6 pm. Self-introductions were made followed by the dinner buffet and guest speakers.

3. SDAMC reelected its present officers to another one-year term: Warren "Pete" Poitras – President, Russ Jeffries – Vice President, and Rick Verbanec – Secretary/Treasurer.

4. Invited speaker: Monterey County Sheriff Steve Bernal:

Monterey County Sheriff Steve Bernal indicated 450 employees work for the Sheriff's Office and there are 26 vacancies in budgeted positions. The primary challenge is recruiting and time necessary for training qualified deputies. His office has worked with the four south county cities to reduce street and gang violence through targeted enforcement. He urged a NO vote on Prop 57 (Criminal sentences/parole) and cautioned that legalization of marijuana (as in Prop 64) has not resulted in less crime in CO and WA due to continued operation of drug cartels. He also complimented CalFire Incident Command and the cooperating fire agencies for improved communications during the Soberanes Fire when 8 to 12 deputies worked the fire primarily for evacuation control.

5. Legislative Update:

Christina Lokke, Senior Legislative Representative with the California Special Districts Association (CSDA), provided copies of the latest Grassroots Action Brief summarizing legislative activities affecting special districts. The Little Hoover Commission is following up on a 2000 Report Special Districts: Relics of the Past or Resources of the Future. CSDA staff attended a hearing on August 25th highlighting the value of special districts. The commission plans to focus on the issue of preparing for climate change and how to use reserves to deal with it at its second hearing on October 27th and to review healthcare districts in an advisory committee meeting November 16th. She also reported that CEQA reform is dead in Sacramento after the Kings stadium deal.

6. Approval of Minutes from the July 19, 2016 meeting:

Minutes of the July 19, 2016 meeting were unanimously approved.

- 8. Informational Reports:
 - a. Legislative Chair Report: It was announced that Vince Ferrante, Board member for Moss Landing Harbor District, has been elected President of CSDA for 2017.
 - b. Finance Committee Chair Report: Financial statement presented.

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- c. CSDA Coastal Network 5 Representative Report: Vince Ferrante reported 1130 of 2000 special districts in CA are members of CSDA and that the next annual CSDA conference will be in Monterey next September.
- d. LAFCO Representatives Report: Kate McKenna, Executive Director of the Local Agency Formation Commission (LAFCO) of Monterey County, reported the City of Greenfield and the fire protection district surrounding the city for are working on an agreement for fire services; staff is reviewing potential areas for Monterey Regional Water Pollution Control Agency to provide wastewater service including Oak Hills, Spreckels, Toro and Los Palmas; and updating Municipal Service Reviews for Pebble Beach and Santa Lucia Community Services Districts.
- e. Other: Monterey County Regional Fire is looking into adding SDAMC as an insured under its policy to reduce costs for insurance mandated by CSDA for membership.

10. Next meeting date:

The next SDAMC meeting is scheduled for Tuesday, January 17, 2017 at 6:00 pm at the Shoreline Conference Center in Marina.
