SDAMC Minutes April 18, 2017

- 1. President Warren "Pete" Poitras called the meeting of the Special Districts Association of Monterey County (SDAMC) to order at 6 pm.
- 2. Self-introductions were made followed by the dinner buffet and guest speakers.
- 3. Invited speakers: Monterey County Supervisor Parker and Supervisor Adams gave presentations on Monterey County issues:

District 4 Supervisor Jane Parker indicated her priorities for the year include getting the Community Power agency on line within a year, sustainable development, affordable housing, workforce development for better Fort Ord jobs and early childhood development. She also believes there should be more women on each Board because studies show a minimum 30% composition of women results in better decisions. Supervisor Parker indicated the primary financial challenges at the county are rising pension and health care costs.

District 5 Supervisor Mary Adams was recently elected to the Board of Supervisors and is the chair since it is the District 5 representative's turn, in rotation. She recognized help from the other Supervisors in learning normal process and indicated her priorities to be water and traffic issues, the short term rental ordinance and the cannabis issue in Monterey County. She was encouraged by the Big Sur Emergency Response to help three isolated enclaves during the recent storms. The public works department is working well in emergencies.

In answer to questions, both Supervisors (and the LAFCO Executive Director) indicated opposition to the idea of cities taking over special district functions as suggested by the Little Hoover Commission. County budget continues to be pressured by PERS and health care costs.

Neil McCormick, California Special Districts Association (CSDA) Executive Director reported on services provided by CSDA. The attached Grassroots Action Brief includes information on the status of the Little Hoover Commission hearings and Legislative issues related to special districts. He reported the annual CSDA conference will be in Monterey this September

District, Carmel Area Wastewater District and Monterey Regional Water Pollution Control Agency. She reported the proposed LAFCO budget for next year includes a 5% increase in revenue, which is equally funded between the County, Cities and Special Districts.
