# SDAMC Minutes July 18, 2017

- 1. President Warren "Pete" Poitras called the meeting of the Special Districts Association of Monterey County (SDAMC) to order at 6 pm.
- 2. Self-introductions were made followed by the dinner buffet and guest speakers.
- 3. Invited speaker: Transportation Agency of Monterey County Grant Leonard:

Mr. Leonard reported on proposed improvements for the Highway 68 corridor between Monterey and Salinas. He indicated surveys related to the Measure X bond identified the Highway 68 corridor as the number one priority corridor in the County and \$50 million of the Measure X proceeds have been allocated to this project. Highway 68 is located on the original wagon trail between missions. TAMC received a Caltrans grant in 2015 to study how to improve traffic operations in the corridor and considered three options. 1) Replace existing traffic intersections with roundabouts (\$48 Million) 2) Replace existing traffic intersections with roundabouts and widen sections between Corral De Tierra and Toro, between Monterey Airport and York Road and add a third lane between Corral De Tierra and Laureles Grade (\$107 Million) 3) Add adaptive signaling and widening consistent with the Ferrini Ranch Development (\$34 Million). An intersection control evaluation using a Caltrans model found all but one intersection had a higher benefit cost ratio with roundabouts compared to signals and that as a whole the corridor would perform best with roundabouts. The need for underground wildlife crossings was also studied using cameras and roadkill data and 10 locations were identified where culvert improvements totaling \$40 million would provide safe wildlife crossings. The TAMC recommendation is a project with a \$60 million budget including new roundabouts and \$10 million worth of wildlife crossing improvements.

#### 4. Anna Palmer, CSDA Update:

Ms. Palmer, from the California Special Districts Association (CSDA) Member Services Team, reported on Legislative issues related to special districts. Our local Director and current CSDA President Vince Ferrante reported the annual CSDA conference will be in Monterey this September.
