April 17, 2018 Special Districts Association Meeting Minutes

The Special Districts Association of Monterey County (SDA) met on April 17, 2018 at the Shoreline Community Center in Marina.

The speaker, Gerry Malais, is the Monterey County Office of Emergency Services (OES) Manager. He is a former Fire Chief and City Councilman and started this position last January. The purpose of the OES office is to prepare the county and citizens for an emergency while working with 12 police and 14 fire jurisdictions. OES sets up an Emergency Operations Center in an emergency to provide interagency coordination. The local OES office has five employees including 3 planners. The disaster management cycle consists of preparation, response, recovery and mitigation. A current point of emphasis is preparing hazard mitigation plans that identify risks and plan to reduce the hazard risk. These plans help qualify for grant funding and break the cycle of repetitive disaster damage thereby reducing the burden on local government. There is \$534 million available nationwide for hazard mitigation funding.

California Special Districts Association (CSDA) field representative Chris Palmer reported the State Legislature is in session reviewing thousands of bills in policy committees. He mentioned CSDA has concerns about SB 929 which requires every special district to have a website because some special districts do not have access to internet. AB 2258 Caballero would provide grant funds to local LAFCO organizations to study agency consolidation. CSDA is concerned that the threshold for voter opposition is being raised from 10% to 25%.

Kate McKenna, Executive Director of the Local Agency Formation Commission (LAFCO) of Monterey County, reported all fire service/EMS agencies will be receiving a letter from LAFCO in the near future requesting information for a regional review. LAFCO is also reviewing applications for annexation from Marina Coast Water District and North County Fire Protection District as well an expanded sphere of influence for Salinas Valley Hospital District where half of the patients live outside the boundaries of the district. She also reported Pete Poitras of Monterey County Regional Fire District has been selected as special district representative on the Oversight Committee for the Redevelopment Agency dissolution.

The next SDA meeting is scheduled for Tuesday, July 17, 2018 at 6:00 pm at the Shoreline Conference Center in Marina.
