Meeting Minutes: July 16, 2019 Special Districts Association of Monterey County

The Special Districts Association of Monterey County (SDA) met on July 16, 2019 at the Bayonet and Black Horse Golf Course Clubhouse in Seaside.

State Senator Bill Monning reported the state of California just passed a \$215 Billion budget including a \$19B reserve. Five percent of the budget is allocated to debt payment. He reported the new governor's priorities are homelessness and housing. The education budget was increased including full tuition support for full time students the first two years of Community College. A \$17 million allocation for the Nacimiento/San Antonio tunnel project was also included. Senator Monning sponsored SB 200 which will be signed by the governor and provides \$130 million over 10 years to provide safe, clean and affordable drinking water. Approximately 1 million California residents cannot drink or use tap water. SB 189, also sponsored by Senator Monning, has passed the Senate. It would reduce the Fort Ord Reuse Authority board from 13 members to five representing land use succession authorities and provide a 2-year transition to local jurisdictions.

California Special Districts Association (CSDA) representative Steven Nascimento reported CSDA supports constitutional amendment ACA1 which would reduce the vote threshold from two thirds to 55% for general obligation bonds. CSDA opposes SB13 which would allow no impact fees on affordable housing and AB 1486 which restricts public agencies ability to sell or lease surplus lands.

CSDA requires the Special Districts Association of Monterey County to carry liability insurance to be a chapter of CSDA. Our representatives are attending these meetings on district business and CSDA believes the insurance issue can be resolved by confirming each agency has liability insurance for district business.

Kate McKenna, Executive Director of the Local Agency Formation Commission of Monterey County (LAFCO), reported the Marina Coast Water District annexation of Fort Ord land was recently approved and Carmel Area Wastewater District proposed annexations in Carmel Valley and Carmel Highlands will be considered at a future LAFCO meeting. A Leadership team of Fire Chiefs, General Managers and County representative will review information from agencies providing Fire Protection and Emergency Medical Services on a countywide level with an emphasis on better serving rural unincorporated areas.

The next SDA meeting is scheduled for Tuesday, October 15, 2019 at 6:00 pm at the Bayonet and Black Horse Golf Course Clubhouse in Seaside.
