January 19, 2021 Special Districts Association Meeting

The Special Districts Association of Monterey County (SDA) met virtually on January 19, 2021.

The group approved the slate of officers for 2021: President Mary Ann Leffel from Monterey Peninsula Airport District, Vice President Pete Poitras from Monterey County Regional Fire District and Treasurer Rick Verbanec from PBCSD.

George Riley made a presentation about public banks. The California Legislature passed a bill in 2019 that provides authority to start ten new public banks. The idea would be for public agencies to pool reserves and loan the funds out for infrastructure projects. A business plan would have to be developed at an estimated cost of \$400,000 before a public bank charter could be issued.

Assembly member Mark Stone reported State revenues are better than expected due to a conservative budget, but revenue is being treated as one time rather than reoccurring. He reported there has been a focus on fire response with more money allocated to CalFire and pointed out more than 60% of forested land in California is Federal. He mentioned there is an emphasis on expanding broadband to rural areas. The pandemic work from home requirements shine a light on which areas have adequate broadband coverage and highlight a glaring problem for businesses and education facilities in rural areas.

Vince Ferrante reported all webinars from the California Special Districts Association (CSDA) are currently free. Charlotte Holifield, CSDA Public Affairs Field Coordinator for the coastal zone, reported Congress member Garamendi is preparing legislation that would allocate 5% of future State pandemic relief funding to Special Districts.

Kate McKenna reported the Monterey County Local Agency Formation Commission (LAFCO) is reviewing a proposed expansion for Carmel Area Wastewater District and a request to activate a latent power to deliver potable water for Monterey Peninsula Water Management District. Staff is working with a Board of Supervisor Ad Hoc Committee to explore funding options for rural fire districts. LAFCO staff is starting a new Boundary and Sphere of Influence study for cities in Monterey County.

The next SDA meeting is scheduled for Tuesday, April 20, 2020 at 6:00 pm either virtually or at the Bayonet and Black Horse Golf Course Clubhouse in Seaside.
