## Special Districts Association of Monterey County April 18, 2023

The Special Districts Association of Monterey County (SDAMC) met in person on April 18, 2023. The meeting began with a moment of silence for the passing of former Moss Landing Harbor District General Manager Linda McIntyre.

Mustafa Hessabi, California Special District Association (CSDA) Deputy General Counsel, identified a number of legislative proposals of concern including AB1637 that would require all government websites to end in ca.gov and AB557 that would allow remote meetings during state of emergencies declared by the Governor. There is also a case from Santa Monica that addresses at large versus by district elections. He reported the CSDA Legislative Days conference in Sacramento is scheduled for May 16 and 17<sup>th</sup> this year and will include a presentation from local State Senator John Laird. He also mentioned that Santa Cruz County is considering formation of a CSDA chapter to represent special districts.

Vince Ferrante, CSDA Director representing the Coastal Network, reported the annual CSDA conference will be held this year in Monterey the last week of August and the Board Secretary/Clerk conference will be in Seaside this November.

Kate McKenna, Executive Director of the Monterey County Local Agency Formation Commission (LAFCO), reported the annual budget and work program is being considered this month with a 2% proposed increase. LAFCO costs are split three ways between the county, cities and special districts. The cost allocation for each special district will be determined by the County Auditor after the budget is approved by LAFCO. Briefs are being prepared for the current litigation with the Monterey Peninsula Water Management District (MPWMD) with the case expected to move to hearings in early August. LAFCO has a \$300,000 legal reserve that has been drawn down halfway this year. LAFCO has no indemnification from MPWMD for this issue because the application for latent powers was not approved. LAFCO staff have been working with five small districts located near Greenfield and Soledad with the hope the cities may be able to provide some administrative help through a cost share arrangement. The City of Soledad approved a major annexation for a large development on the north side of town with a special condition that the City has to receive LAFCO approval for an agricultural mitigation ordinance. Castroville Community Services District has a request for some small annexations in Moss Landing and Oak Hills areas.

The next SDA meeting is scheduled for Tuesday, July 18, 2023 at 6:00 pm at the Bayonet and Black Horse Golf Course Clubhouse in Seaside. The speaker for the next event will be Monterey County Treasurer Mary Zeeb.
